

A WEEKLY SEW-ALONG CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

QUILT CONCERT #1

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QUILT CONCERT is a collaborative project between Cassandra of The (Not So) Dramatic Life and Lissa of Lovingly Lissa. This quilt merges traditional blocks with new designs to create a Modern-Traditional composition embracing alternative gridwork.

SKILL LEVEL: Confident Beginner

Printing: This pattern does NOT require printing. If you choose to print, use Adobe Acrobat Reader for best results. The free download of this program is available here: https://get.adobe.com/reader/

FINISHED QUILT SIZE: 48"x 60"

All Seam allowances are 1/4"

GLOSSARY:

HST: Half Square Triangle

Right Side: The "pretty" side of the fabric that you will want facing out when the quilt is finished. Wrong Side: The back of the fabric that will touch the batting and won't be seen when the quilt is

complete.

WOF: Width of Fabric from selvage to selvage

Yardage:

Fabric A (Blue): 1-3/4 yard Fabric B (Red): 1 yard Fabric C (Pink): 3/4 yard Fabric D (Orange): 3/4 yard Fabric E (Violet): 3/4 yard

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS FABRIC A (BLUE) 1-3/4 YARDS

Row 1

Cut one WOF strip 10" wide. From this strip cut:

- One 10" Square (for Block 10)
- One 9-1/4" Square (for Block 10)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 1 into two lengthwise strips, one 5" wide and one 4-7/8" wide. From the 5" wide strip cut:

• Four 5" Squares (two for Block 1, two for Block 10)

From the 4-7/8" strip cut:

• Four 4-7/8" Squares (for Block 10)

Row 2

Cut one WOF strip 7-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

• Five 7-1/2" Squares (for Block 13)

Row 3

Cut one WOF strip 7" wide. From this strip cut:

• Three 7" Squares (for Block 1)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 3 in half lengthwise to form two 3-1/2" strips. From these strips cut:

• Four 3-1/2"x 6-1/2" Rectangles (for Block 3)

Row 4

Cut one WOF strip 6-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- •One 6-1/2" Square (for Block 9)
- Two 5-1/4" Squares (for Block 1)
- Four 4-1/2" Squares (three for Block 10, one for Block 14)

Rows 5, 6, AND 7

Cut three WOF strips 3-7/8" wide. From these strips cut:

• Twenty-eight 3-7/8" Squares (sixteen for Block 1, eight for Block 5, and four for Block 9)

Rows 8 and 9

Cut two WOF strips 3-1/2" wide. From these strips cut:

• Seventeen 3-1/2" Squares (four for Block 3, one for Block 9, two for block 12, two for Block 15, eight for block 16)

Row 10

Cut one WOF strip 3" wide. From this strip cut:

- Two 3"x 8" Rectangles (one for Block 7 and one for Block 11)
- Eight 3" Squares (two for Block 2 and six for Block 8)

Row 11


Cut one WOF strip 2-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Four 2-1/2" Squares (for Block 6)
- •One 2-1/2"x 27" Strip (for Block 16)

Row 12

Cut one WOF strip 1-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- •One 1-1/2"x 23" Strip (for Block 2)
- Two 1-1/2"x 5" Rectangles (for Block 4)
- Two 1-1/2"x 3" Rectangles (for Block 4)



CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS FABRIC B (RED) 1 YARD

Row 1

Cut one WOF strip 10" wide. From this strip cut:

•One 10" Square (for Block 10)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 1 into two lengthwise strips, one 2-1/2" wide and one 7-1/2" wide. From the 7-1/2" wide strip cut:

- •One 7-1/2" Square (for Block 13)
- •Three 7-1/4" Squares (for Block 1)

From the 2-1/2" strip cut:

- Four 2-1/2" Squares (for Block 6)
- Two 1-1/2" x 8" Rectangles (for Block 7)

Row 2

Cut one WOF strip 4-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Five 4-1/2" Squares (four for Block 10 and one for Block 14)
- •Two 3-1/2"x 6-1/2" Rectangles (for Block 12)
- •One 3-1/2" Square (for Block 12)

Row 3

Cut one WOF strip 3-7/8" wide. From this strip cut:

- Eight 3-7/8" Squares (for Block 9)
- One 3-1/2"x 6-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 15)

Row 4

Cut one WOF strip 3-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Nine 3-1/2" Squares (eight for Block 3 and one for Block 12)
- One 3-1/2"x 6-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 15)


Row 5

Cut one WOF strip 3" wide. From this strip cut:

• Two 3" Squares (for Block 2)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 5 in half lengthwise to create two 1-1/2" Strips. From these strips cut:

- •One 1-1/2"x 23" Strip (for Block 2)
- •One 1-1/2"x 29" Strip (for Block 16)

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS FABRIC C (PINK) 3/4 YARD

Row 1

Cut one WOF strip 9-1/4" wide. From this strip cut:

- •One 9-1/4" Square (for Block 10)
- Two 7-1/2" Squares (for Block 13)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 1 lengthwise into two strips, one 3" wide and the second 5" wide. From the 3" wide strip cut:

•One 3"x 12" Rectangle (for Block 11)

From the 5" wide strip cut:

- Two 5" Squares (for Block 1)
- •One 4-1/2" Square (for Block 1)

Row 2

Cut one WOF strip 4-7/8" wide. From this strip cut:

• Four 4-7/8" Squares (for Block 10)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 2 lengthwies into two strips, one 3" wide and the second 1-1/2" wide. From the 3" wide strip cut:

• Six 3" Squares (for Block 8)

From the 1-1/2" strip cut:

• Two 1-1/2"x 8" Rectangles (for Block 7)

Row 3

Cut one WOF strip 3-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Three 3-1/2"x 6-1/2" Rectangles (one for Block 3 and two for Block 12)
- Five 3-1/2" Squares (three for Block 9 and two for Block 15)

Row 4

Cut one WOF strip 2-7/8" wide. From this strip cut:

• Eight 2-7/8" Squares (for Block 1)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 4 lengthwise to create a 1-1/2" wide strip. From this strip cut:

• Two 1-1/2"x 8" Rectangles (for Block 11)

Row 5


Cut one WOF strip 2-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- •One 2-1/2"x 27" Rectangle (for Block 16)
- •One 2-1/2"x 12-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 8)

Row 6

Cut one WOF strip 2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Four 2" Squares (for Block 6)
- •One 1-1/2"x 8-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 2)



CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS FABRIC D (ORANGE) 3/4 YARD

Row 1

Cut one WOF strip 8-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- •One 8-1/2" Square (for Block 10)
- •One 7-1/2" Square (for Block 13)
- Three 7-1/4" Squares (one for Block 1, two for Block 9)

Row 2

Cut one WOF strip 7" wide. From this strip cut:

•One 7" Square (for Block 1)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 2 lengthwise into two strips, one 1-1/2" wide and the second 4-1/2" wide. From the 1-1/2" wide strip cut:

•One 1-1/2"x 29" Rectangle (for Block 16)

From the 4-1/2" wide strip cut:

- •One 4-1/2" Square (for Block 10)
- Two 4" Squares (for Block 16)

Cut the remaining fabric from the 4-1/2" wide strip lengthwise into two strips, one 1-1/2" wide and the second 3" wide. From the 1-1/2" wide strip cut:

- •One 1-1/2"x 11" Rectangle (for Block 4)
- •One 1-1/2"x 5-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 2)

From the 3" wide strip cut:

- •One 3"x 8" Rectangle (for Block 7)
- •One 3" Square (for Block 4)
- •One 2-1/2" Square (for Block 4)

ROW 3

Cut on WOF strip 3-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- One 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 3)
- Eight 3-1/2" Squares (four for Block 12 and four for Block 15)



CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS FABRIC E (VIOLET) 3/4 YARD

Row 1

Cut one WOF strip 7-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- •One 7-1/2" Square (for Block 13)
- Three 7-1/4" Squares (two for Block 5 and one for Block 9)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 1 lengthwise into two strips, one 5" and the second 1-1/2" wide. From the 5" strip cut:

• Two 5" Squares (for Block 10)

From the 1-1/2" strip cut:

•One 1-1/2"x 8-1/2" Rectangle (for Block 2)

Row 2

Cut one WOF strip 7" wide. From this strip cut:

• Two 7" Squares (for Block 1)

Cut the remaining fabric from Row 2 lengthwise into two strips, one 4" and the second 3" wide. From the 4" strip cut:

• Four 4" Squares (two for Block 14 and two for Block 16)

From the 3" wide strip cut:

•One 3"x 12" Rectangle (for Block 11)

Row 3

Cut one WOF strip 3-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Four 3-1/2"x 6-1/2" Rectangles (two for Block 3 and two for Block 15)
- Four 3-1/2" Squares (for Block 9)

Row 4


Cut one WOF strip 2-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- Four 2-1/2" Squares (for Block 6)
- One 2-1/2"x 27" Rectangle (for Block 16)

Row 5

Cut one WOF strip 1-1/2" wide. From this strip cut:

- One 1-1/2"x 29" Rectangle (for Block 16)
- •One 1-1/2"x 11" Rectangle (for Block 4)



Fabric E Cutting Diagram
