

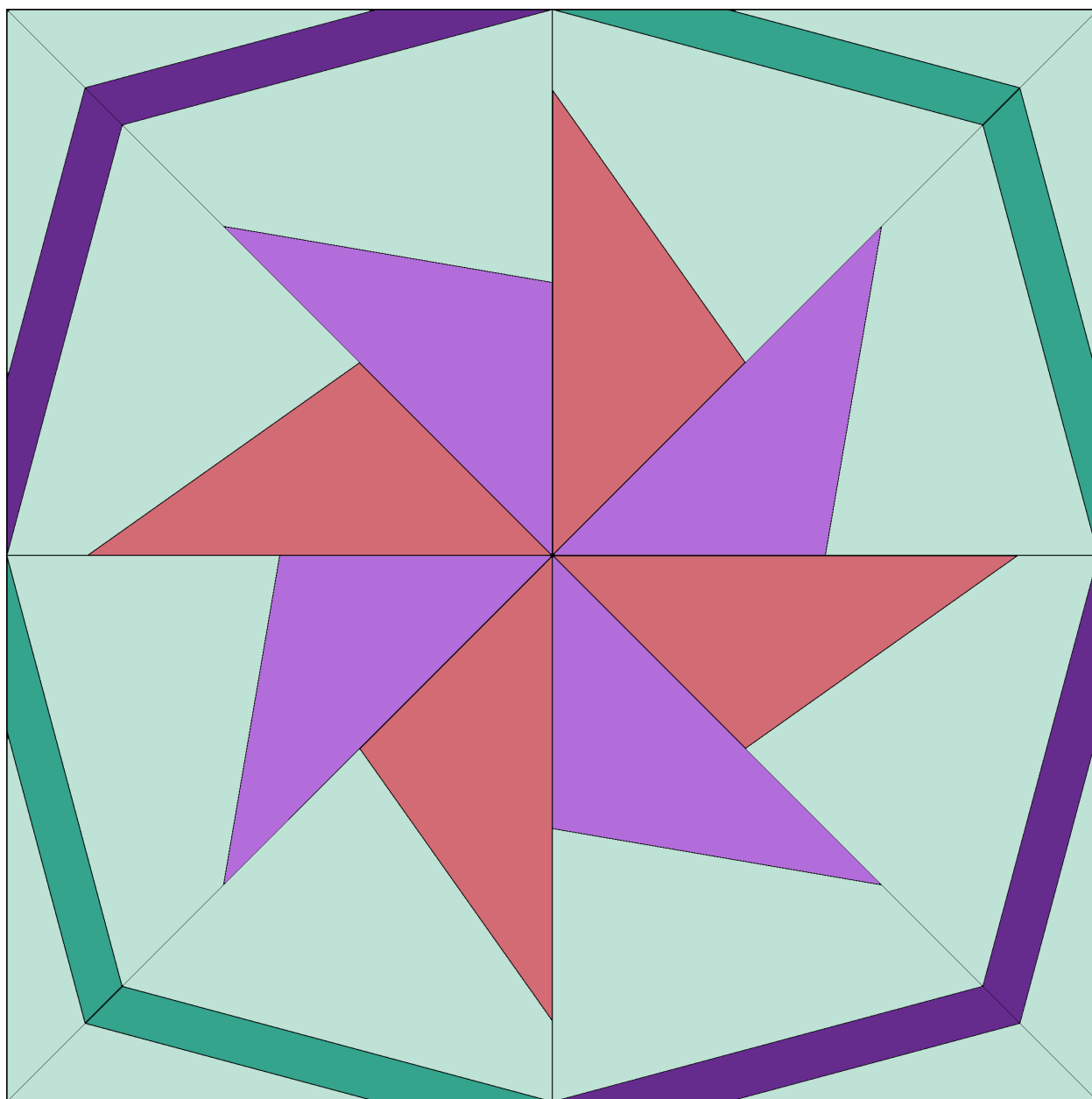

Quilt Concert is a collaborative project between Cassandra of The (Not So) Dramatic Life and Lissa of Lovingly Lissa. This quilt uses foundation paper piecing to create traditional and traditionally inspired star block set in a field of negative space

Skill Level: Confident Beginner

Printing: This pattern requires printing of the foundation paper piecing templates. Always print templates at 100% or “actual size.” Use Adobe Acrobat Reader for best results. The free download of this program is available here: <https://get.adobe.com/reader/>

Finished Quilt Size: 60" x 72"

Finished Block Size: 15" x 15" (15-1/2" x 15-1/2" unfinished)

All Seam allowances are 1/4"

Glossary:

FPP: Foundation Paper Piecing

WOF: Width of Fabric

Right Side: The “pretty” side of the fabric that you will want facing out when the quilt is finished.

Wrong Side: The back of the fabric that will touch the batting and won’t be seen when the quilt is complete.

CUTTING NOTE: All blocks are foundation paper pieced. The cutting instructions in the table below are for rough-cutting each section of fabric to ensure coverage of each FPP section. Rough cutting is *not required*, and if you have a preferred technique for FPP, we encourage you to use it for this quilt.

Block #4 Rough Cutting			
Fabric A (Light Teal-Background)			
8	6" x 7" Rectangles (for section 2)		
8	2-1/4" x 6--1/4" Rectangles (for section 4)		
Fabric C (Medium Teal)		Fabric D (Dark Violet)	
4	7-1/2" x 2- 3/4" Rectangles (for section 3)	4	7-1/2" x 2- 3/4" Rectangles (for section 3)
Fabric E (Coral Pink)		Fabric F (Light Violet)	
4	7-1/2" x 3-3/4" Rectangles (for section 1)	4	7-1/2" x 3-3/4" Rectangles (for section 1)

FOUNDATION PAPER PIECING TEMPLATES

Print the templates on the last four pages of the pattern at 100% scale or "actual size." Print two of each page to create the block. Measure the 1" square on each template plate to ensure the template has printed at the correct scale.

The block construction diagrams in this quilt are shown in the Teal themed color way using Light Teal, Dark Teal, Medium Teal, Dark Violet, Coral Pink, and Light Violet fabrics. Use the hatching key below to determine the fabric placement on the foundation paper piecing templates. (Figure 1).

BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

1. Foundation Paper Piece two each of segments A-D using your favorite foundation paper piecing technique. For a video tutorial of foundation paper piecing this block, see the link on page 3. While paper piecing, remember that you will stitch on the printed side of the template and place the fabric on the blank side of the paper. The segments may be constructed in any order. Arrange the segments as shown. (Figure 2)
2. Stitch each segment A to a segment B and each segment C to a segment D. Press seam allowances toward segment B or D. (Figure 3)

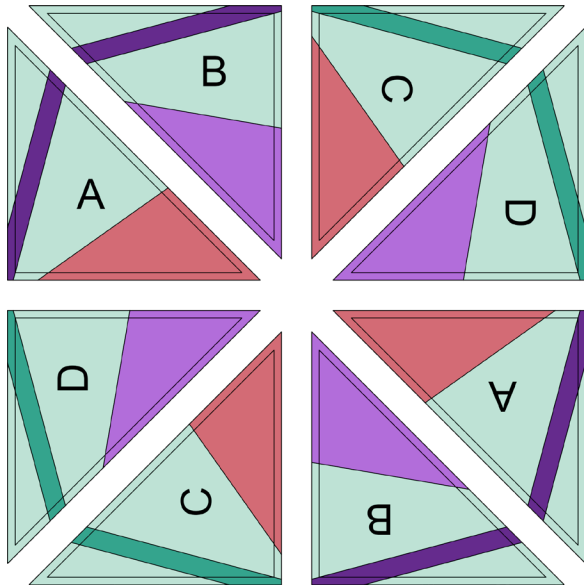

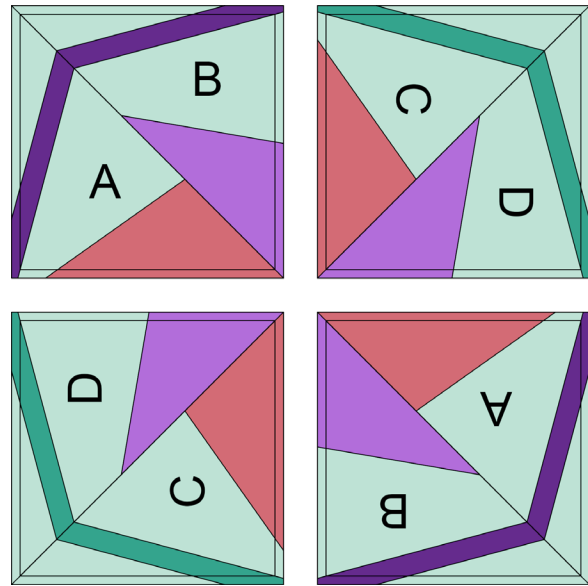

3. Stitch the rows together. Press seam allowances toward segment C. (Figure 4)
4. Stitch the rows together. Press, spinning the seam allowances appropriately (see note below), to complete the block. Set aside the block until the final assembly process. (Figure 5)

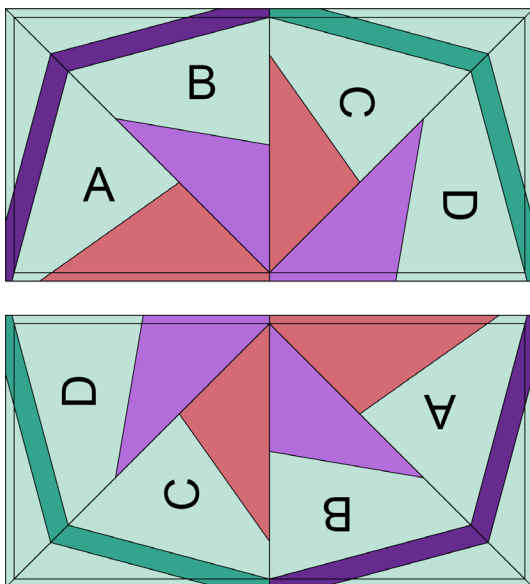
